And your Nominees for Board of Trustees are...

Neil Horwitz

I was born and lived most of my life in Brooklyn, New York. I moved to a condo in Westford in January 2014 and then to VSR in



June 2018. As you may surmise, as a former New Yorker, I remain a fan of the Yankees and the football Giants, but even with these biases, I still feel that I can serve as Trustee in the best interests of VSR.

In New York, I taught elementary school for seven years before embarking on a legal career. My law practice, which is still active, primarily involves estate planning, but also real estate closings, finances and other matters.

VSR Annual Meeting ~ September 25th at 7 pm

Election ballots will soon be mailed to every unit owner of record and will list the two candidates for Trustee. The ballot (one per unit) will request voting for two candidates for the three (3) year terms on or before the Annual Meeting, September 25, 2019. All ballots will be collected in the locked voting box, located in the Clubhouse Entry. All will then be delivered to Evergreen Management Inc. for tallying following the Annual Meeting. Extra time is needed since the vote cast by each unit is required to be weighted by the percent interest in VSR of that unit. The candidates receiving the highest number of weighted votes will fill the designated positions.

toun Solution What is Town Square and why is it important?

Residents of VSR have been encouraged by Evergreen to sign up online for TownSq, which also has a mobile phone app that you can use. This service was developed to meet three needs for a managed community:

- the need to easily connect with neighbors,
- to securely collaborate with community management teams at EGM and their vendors
- and the need to stay up to date on the latest community happenings.

You can also check your ledger at your leisure by opening the app on your phone, receive instant notifications from Management preventing delays, by you not having to check your email. And, you may instant message your Evergreen Administrator with any questions or concerns.

Ultimately the goal is to use this tool to send important announcements and dates, to take the place of VSR Blast emails so you can keep all this info in one location instead of your email box, and to allow residents to have a place to have online discussions about pertinent VSR topics, seek help or assistance, and to have quick access to the most up to date policies and procedures, regulations, and architectural guidelines. If you have yet to log on or are unsure how to go about it please contact <u>Christina Donahue</u> at Evergreen. Once we are all signed up we will plan a hands-on workshop at our clubhouse.

Many of us find it difficult to stick to some form of exercise, others don't know where to start. Experts say the key to taking up or keeping to any form of physical activity is to have fun. By the end of 2019 over 200 VSR exercise



classes will have been shared by our residents. Many participants have commented on gaining greater flexibility, strength, increased range of motion, and well-being. Whatever your age or physical condition exercise can contribute to small, consistent changes to maintain health and fitness over 60.

We have 3 class offerings to help us all "get off the couch" and enjoy getting fit with our village peers.

<u> Chair / Ball Yoga</u>

Content: Chair yoga is a gentle form of yoga that is practiced sitting on a chair, or standing using a chair for support. It is appropriate for beginners, adapted to your experience and skillset, as well as experienced yogis. Almost any traditional yoga pose or move can be replicated and altered to accommodate chair yoga. **Requirements:** None; no floor work. Grab a chair on your way to class. **Class Times:** Tuesdays (1:00 - 2:00 pm)

Fusion

Content: This class is a blend of cardio (to increase your heart rate and improve your cardio vascular system using simple moves), strength (using either free weights, body weight resistance or resistance tubing to build muscle), and stretching (to gain and/or maintain flexibility). Great for all levels as personal modifications can be made easily. Class exercises may vary weekly.

Requirements: None; no floor work.

Class Times: Tuesday evenings (6:15-7:00 pm)

Yoga

Content: There are many benefits from a gentle style of yoga which aim to unite the mind, body, and spirit. Yoga helps with flexibility and realignment, and stretches muscles through holding poses and using breathing techniques. Yoga also helps calm the mind by releasing the days' activities as you concentrate on poses that require you to stretch and bend in standing, sitting, and lying positions. Many people experience a sense of greater well-being after just one class!

Requirements: Students need to bring an exercise mat. **Class Times:** Wednesdays and Fridays (9:00 – 10:00 am)


BOOK CLUB NEWS by Dianne Marston


